Robert Bly, *Iron John* (1990) – a classic of the mythopoeic men's movement

Robert Bly, *The Sibling Society* (1996) – a “plea for adulthood,” demonstrating the need for rites of passage

Jean Shinoda Bolen, *Gods in Every Man: A New Psychology of Men's Lives and Loves* (1989) – a Jungian take on contemporary masculinity; partner book to her books on women and goddesses

David Deida, *The Way of the Superior Man: A Spiritual Guide to Mastering the Challenges of Women, Work and Sexual Desire* (1997) – a kick-ass, post-liberal, post-SNAG take on men getting their act together

Tad Guzie and Noreen Monroe Guzie, *About Men and Women* (1986) – a Jungian, psychological-types take on male-female partnership; Catholic perspective

Thomas Hart, *What Does it Mean to be a Man?* (2004) – a book on male spirituality (with or without religion) from a well-known spiritual director

Daniel J. Levinson et al., *The Seasons of a Man's Life* (1978) – the groundbreaking study that was the basis for Gail Sheehy's writing in the *Passages* series; academic, sociological

James B. Nelson, *The Intimate Connection: Male Sexuality, Masculine Spirituality* (1988) – a classic from a theologian of sexuality

Samuel Osherson, *Finding our Fathers: How a Man's Life is Shaped by his Relationship with his Father* (1986) – the title says it all

Richard Rohr, *Adam's Return: The Five Promises of Male Initiation* (2004) – the most recent book from the leader of men's rites of passage movement

Deborah Tannen, *You Just Don't Understand: Women and Men in Conversation* (1990) – a linguist studies patterns of male-female conversation

Marie-Louise von Franz, *The Problem of the Puer Aeternus*, 3rd ed. (2000) – from Jung's chief disciple, on why boys don't grow up, the Peter Pan syndrome
